An experienced, motivated workforce.

Washington workers thrive in an environment where lifelong learning is the norm, not the exception. Unique public-private partnerships supply a steady stream of workers trained in the latest tools and technologies.

A center for international trade.

With its centralized access to Asian and European markets, 75 ports and 139 airports, Washington State is the fourth largest exporter in the U.S., shipping more than \$81 billion in goods worldwide.

Low-cost, renewable energy.

Nearly 75% of the state's power is derived from hydroelectric sources and energy rates are as low as 4.25¢ per kWh. The energy grid is well suited for cloud computing, composites, advanced manufacturing, food processing and other business lines where scalable, stable power is needed.

Business friendly.

Washington State does not levy taxes on personal or corporate income. Businesses in key growth sectors are eligible for reduced or deferred taxes as well as tax credits. Washington has been ranked #6 in business tax climate and the 4th best place to start a business — in the world!

A great place to live.

Washington's climate is very mild compared to many parts of the country. People are laid back and friendly and an eclectic culture offers residents a lively arts scene, world-class restaurants, one-of-a-kind festivals and breathtaking scenery at nearly every turn.



CLUSTERED

The state offers boundless opportunities in key sectors - aerospace, agriculture/food processing, life sciences/global health, clean tech, information and communication technology, maritime, and military & defense — a business culture characterized by cross-collaboration, experimentation, partnership, innovation and invention.

INNOVATIVE

Washington is a state of firsts. Eddie Bauer came up with the first down parkas; K2 invented the first fiberglass snow skis; the kidney dialysis machine, portable heart defibrillator and jumbo jet were developed in Washington too. So were the world's first espresso cart, tree farm and yum! — Cinnabons.

SMART

31.4% of the population has advanced degrees and the state's two public universities, private and public colleges, 34 community colleges and workforce training programs ensure a continuous supply of highly educated and skilled workers. Washington residents are curious by nature, as witnessed by our bevvy of bookstores and public libraries.

CONNECTED

Washington's transportation network includes 75 ports, 139 airports, 3,300 miles of roadways and the state is equidistant to European and Asian markets, making it the ideal place for exporting products and services. The Internet and Washington are one; 98.7% of all residents have access to broadband and 83% of all households are connected to the Internet.

ENERGETIC

73% of the state's power comes from renewable energy sources, including hydroelectric, solar and wind. The state's network of hydroelectric power plants is the largest in the nation, allowing Washington to be one of the lowest cost energy providers in the United States.

SAVVY



OUR MAJOR INDUSTRIES

AEROSPACE

The undisputed leader in U.S. aerospace, Washington State has been designing and building revolutionary aircraft for nearly a century, including the next-generation 737 MAX, 777X and 787 Dreamliner. The state's 1,350 aerospace companies produce parts, products and services for aircraft manufacturers and airlines around the globe. More than 132,500 workers are employed in Washington's aerospace sector.

LIFE SCIENCES & **GLOBAL HEALTH**

Anchored by Fred Hutchinson Cancer Research Center, Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, a national research laboratory and 500 life science/global health organizations, Washington State has been a pioneer in medical research and global health since 1858. Researchers have a history of pushing the boundaries of life sciences, from developing the portable heart defibrillator to using synthetic scorpion venom to isolate cancerous cells.

CLEAN TECHNOLOGY

From innovative energy storage solutions and power management technologies to biofuels made from the byproducts of the forest industry, more than 80 companies in Washington are taking advantage of the state's clean tech strategies and targeted tax incentives to explore new ways to reduce the world's carbon footprint.

MARITIME

Washington's maritime history is world renowned. More super yachts are built in Washington State than in all the other 49 states combined. More than 2,100 companies generate \$15.2 billion in gross revenue annually and are engaged in passenger

maintenance: maritime logistics and shipping; fishing and seafood products; and maritime

INFORMATION & COMMUNICATION TECHNOLOGY (ICT)

Washington's ICT sector is #2 in the nation, employing 164,000 +tech-based workers in 14,000 different companies, from juggernauts such as Microsoft, Amazon and Cray to smaller start-ups bent on becoming the next big thing. The state is also home to 300 gaming companies, including Valve, Bungie, Big Fish and PopCap Games.
